Elizabeth "Liz" Benham is the president of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, (NFBPWC-USA 2013-2018). She served as International President of IFBPW 2008-2011 and IFBPW Vice President of Membership 2005-2008. Liz was appointed in 1997 as a permanent delegate of IFBPW to the United Nations, New York and is serving as Treasurer of CoNGO (Conference of Non-Governmental Organizations in Consultative Relationship with the United Nations) 2012-2018. Liz has been a BPW member for 29 years.

Her achievements were acknowledged by the "Woman of the Year" award from BPW New York, the "Lena Award" from EPW USA, proclamations from the Council of New York City and the United States House of Representatives recorded in the 111th Congressional Record of Congress.

Liz's career began as a nurse Midwife in Obstetrics and then transitioned ambitiously into her own business in the construction industry. Having over 25 years of import, export, sales, marketing and management experience, serving major retailers and wholesalers across the USA and Canada she generated incremental annual sales revenues up to USD 22 million. Her newest business, Sunny Seaside LLC, based in Florida, handles real estate management and consultancy. Liz also trademarked and patented an invention called "the Footle" for sliding screen doors.
